### **EUGENE KIM PROMOTED TO VICE PRESIDENT AT STV**

He currently is involved in several important California transportation projects, including the South Bay Metro Green Line draft environmental impact statement/draft environmental impact report, the environmental impact statement for the Los Angeles-to-Orange County segment of the California High-Speed Rail, the Los Angeles International Airport Strategic Transportation Master Plan, and the program management oversight of fixed guideway projects funded by the Orange County Transportation Authority's Go Local program.

Kim earned a Doctor of Philosophy in urban planning (transportation) from the University of California at Los Angeles, a Master of Urban and Regional Planning from the University of California at Irvine, and a Bachelor of Arts in economics and history at the University of California at Berkeley. He is a fellow at the Eno Transportation Foundation.
